THE FUTURE: The Internet has evolved into a virtual reality world where you can live out your every fantasy in complete anonymity. Identities are blurred, dreams real, and culpability seemingly nonexistent. This is the world of Jennifer Haley's play *The Nether*, a crime drama and sci-fi thriller that explores the moral and psychological implications of human relationships in an increasingly technological age.

A new virtual wonderland provides total sensory immersion. Just log in, choose an identity and indulge your every whim, no matter how dark or sinister—it's not "real," right? But when a young detective uncovers an ominous brand of entertainment, she triggers a dark battle over technology and human desire. Winner of the 2012 Susan Smith Blackburn Prize, *The Nether* is both serpentine crime drama and haunting sci-fi thriller that explores the consequences of living out our private dreams.

The World Premiere of The Nether was produced by Center Theatre Group/Kirk Douglas Theatre, Michael Ritchie, Artistic Director, in Los Angeles, CA in 2013. It opened at the Royal Court in July 2014 and immediately transferred to the West End. Its New York engagement at MCC, which premiered in February 2015, was extended three times.

Jennifer Haley is a playwright whose work delves into ethics in virtual reality and the impact of technology on our human relationships, identity, and desire. She won the 2012 Susan Smith Blackburn Prize for her play, *The Nether*, produced in Los Angeles, off-Broadway, and on London's West End. Other plays include *Neighborhood 3: Requisition of Doom*, a horror story about suburban video game addiction, and *Froggy*, a noir thriller with interactive media design and a live soundtrack. She is a member of New Dramatists in New York City and lives in Los Angeles, where she founded the Playwrights Union.

Bill English (Director/Artistic Director), an accomplished singer, pianist and composer, has spent his life producing works of art. He co-founded San Francisco Playhouse, and in 13 years, has overseen its growth from a storefront to a major regional theater company, with a 6-play main stage series, a 2-play World Premiere series, an education program and a New Works program that has commissioned 10 playwrights.
